The food of Bengal is a delightful blend of sweetness, spice, and subtlety. Every dish tells a story of tradition, history, and love for flavour and it spans a variety of textures, from crispy and crunchy to smooth and creamy.

The pungent flavour of mustard and the nutty taste of poppy seeds permeate many vegetarian and non vegetarian dishes.

The prevalence of non-vegetarian food habits seen in the people can be attributed mainly to cultural, historical and geographical factors. Non vegetarian dishes like macher jhol, shorshe ilish(fish preparations) and Kosha mangsho (spicy mutton preparation) are the favourites.

Vegetarian dishes are equally celebrated with great reverence."Shukto" (a bitter-sweet mixed vegetable dish), "beguni" (eggplant fritters), and "aloo posto" (potatoes cooked with poppy seeds) are worth trying.

The use of mustard oil, along with finely balanced spices, transforms simple ingredients into flavourful masterpieces.

Street food is an experience on its own,not to be missed if you ever visit the place.It's like a feast for the senses. The aroma of freshly fried Kachoris, rolls and jhalmuri fills the air, making it impossible to resist trying something,especially in the evening.

Try snacks like "phuchka" (pani puri) offering a crispy shell filled with spicy tamarind water, potatoes, and chickpeas, "Kathi roll," a wrap filled with spiced kebabs. Not to miss a cup of "cha" (tea), often served with fried snacks like "singara" i.e "samosa."

A must mention are the iconic sweets. "Rosogolla," a spongy, syrup-soaked treat, and "sandesh," a soft, milk-based sweet, are famous throughout the world. "Misti doi" is a comforting dessert, often served in earthen pots, with its deep, rich flavour enhanced by the slow fermentation process. Nolen Gur, also known as date palm jaggery, is a special treat in many households!

So if you get a chance to visit Kolkata,definitely dive into the diverse and flavourful cuisine. You are bound to enjoy the food-it's a promise.

In her 1942 book, *The Speed of Darkness*, she writes, "The universe is made of stories, not atoms." Stories are the pulse of human life. They are not limited to books or movies but live in every conversation, tradition, and memory. History, for instance, is not just a list of dates and events; it is the story of visionaries, heroes, and ordinary people who dared to dream and act. From the bravery of freedom fighters to the perseverance of inventors, it is through stories that we connect with the past and find inspiration for the future.

Even science, which dissects the material world, relies on storytelling. Theories and discoveries are presented as narratives that make sense of data and reveal the wonders of the universe. Consider how the story of Isaac Newton and the falling apple captures the essence of gravity, or how the tales of Marie Curie's dedication inspire generations to pursue knowledge against all odds.

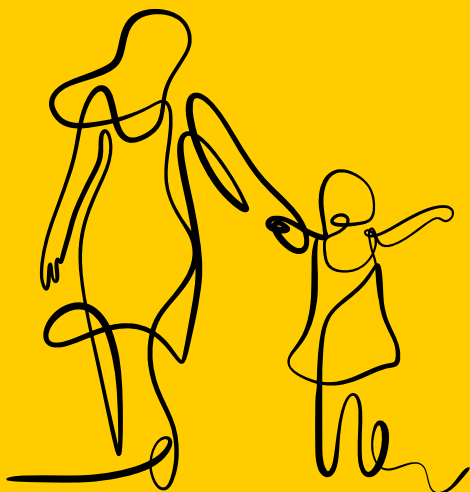

But I'd still say... She is the best!!

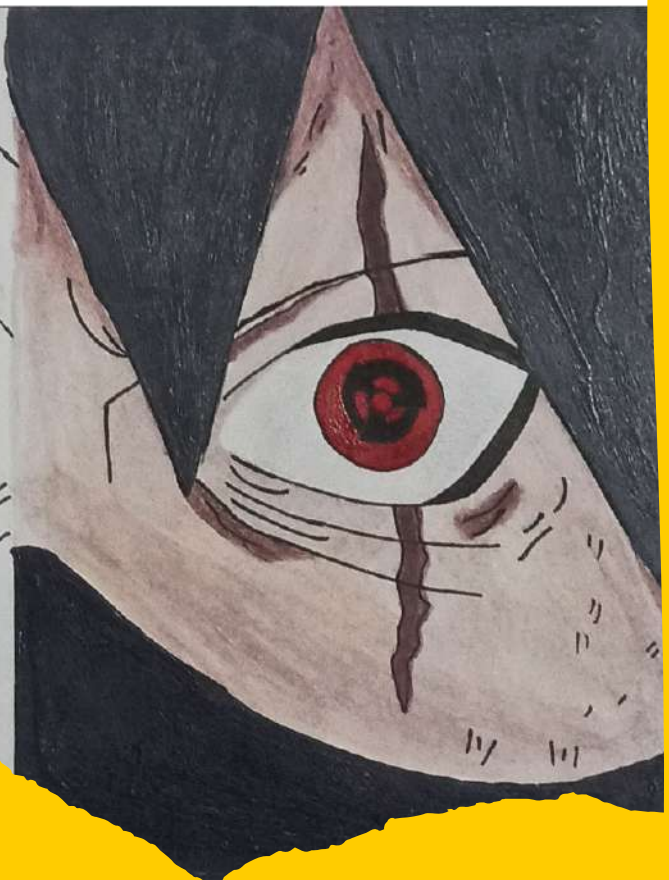

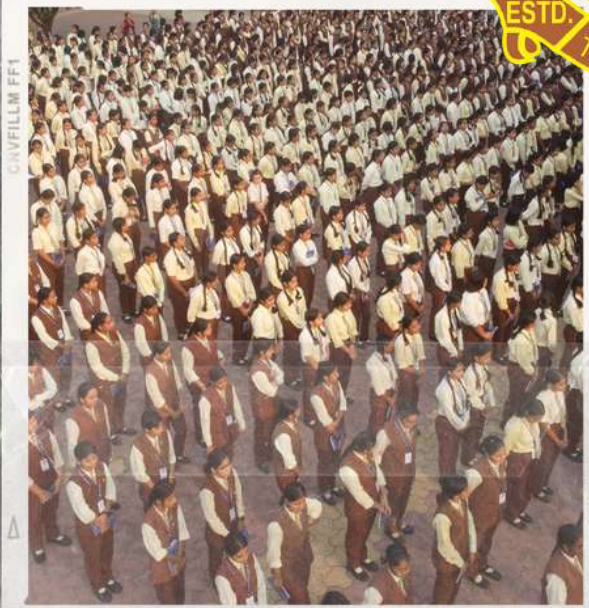
